**REGULAR MEETING MINUTES MAY 7, 2019**

**Departmental Reports:** Mayor Sellers stated that Council should have a copy of the Departmental Reports in their possession. He stated that if they have any questions to please reach out to the individual Director. He stated that if they have additional questions, they can contact the Office of the Mayor as well for further discussion.

### **Residents' Requests and Comments:**

**Patricia Young** stated she was representing the Cinema Park Homeowners Association and wanted to follow up on what was discussed at their last meeting about the City closing on the two parcels.

**Mayor Sellers** reported that they contacted the County Land Bank to start the process on the two parcels that are adjacent to Miles Road that are not owned by any entity. He stated that one parcel has the tension basin on it and has been cleaned out because the County has to foreclose on those parcels. He reported that since there is no owner, the Cinema Park residents have taken care of the front part of the lawn. He stated we can go out there and make the transition when there is a vacant property and then have contractual people cut the lawn. He remarked that it is not a quick process because the County Land Bank has to contact the County Prosecutor's Office and there has to be a legal proceeding.

**Ms. Young** asked if there is an estimated timeline.

**Building Commissioner Ben Brown** replied that a foreclosure could take six months. **Mayor Sellers** stated that in the Interim period until ownership is resolved, we are going to cut the grass like any vacant property around here.

**Ms. Young** asked if they are going to cut it.

**Mayor Sellers** answered that they will cut it because it is not owned by Cinema Park residents but they have been absorbing it as a good steward so that was made clear at the meeting.

**Ms. Young** inquired if the City will cut the other adjacent parcels.

**Mayor Sellers** replied that everything else in there is owned by someone.

**Ms. Young** asked if there was to be another traffic study after Amazon opened.

**Mayor Sellers** stated that there was one study and then a secondary study before Amazon and it was turned over to the HOA and some of the people on the Board. He stated that he can get her a copy of the studies.

**Ms. Young** asked if a third study can be requested since Amazon has opened and the traffic pattern has definitely changed.

**Mayor Sellers** stated that they will look in to it.

**Ms. Young** reported that the grass at Dandridge Drive 11145 has not been cut in the neighborhood and it is a City owned house.

**Service Director Ted Sims** stated he will take care of it.

**Ms. Young** commented that she has a concern with her own property at 11143 Dandridge Drive with water pooling in the back. She stated it is moving closer and closer to her house and asked of the Building Department and Engineer can analyze what is going on because she does not want her house to be flooded. She stated there is a big puddle of water that is getting bigger every year.

**Building Commissioner Ben Brown** stated he will come out to take a look and see what if going on.

**Ms. Young** thanked everyone for their time and stated she was appreciative.

**Traci Mitchell**, School Board President stated that there are a few things she wanted to share that are going on in the District. She announced that tomorrow is their annual STEAM Fair from 4:00p.m.-8:00p.m. at the high school and all of the children are going to display their projects. She reported on May 17, the students in partnership with Karamu House are hosting a Spring play "Children of the Earth" inspired by the book, *Children of Blood and Bone* by Tomi Adeyemi in the high school auditorium at 7:00p.m. She stated that May 19 will be the high school graduation on the football field at 2:00p.m. and their Commencement speaker is Ms. Ariane Kirkpatrick, an alum that is very well known in the community. She thanked the Mayor.

**James White** stated that he has noticed a couple of problems where he resides. He asked why on Garbage Day are there no signs that say No Parking on the streets. He stated he has observed when the sanitation workers arrive and someone is parked on the street they have to get out the truck, hook it up and then put the can down in the middle of the street.

**Mayor Sellers** responded that if it is during daylight people can park on the street. **Mr. White** responded that it makes no sense for the sanitation workers when people are allowed to park on the street at that time. He asked Mayor Sellers how he would like to get out in the rain and stuff.

**Mayor Sellers** answered that is not his concern because he has a contract with Kimble to get the trash so they are going to get the trash whether a car is there or not.

**Mr. White** asked if City employees have a privilege where they do not have to worry about the law. He explained that he saw a City employee run a stop sign.

**Mayor Sellers** joked that he is going to need Mr. White to make a Citizen's Arrest.

**Mayor Sellers** asked if this was someone in the Service Department or Police Department.

**Mr. White** responded that it was the Service Department and there was another instance that the Service Department was working on the lot and the serviceman had his door wide open while eating and Mr. White had to drive around him. He asked if that makes any sense.

**Mayor Sellers** stated that it did not and the Service Director Ted Sims agreed and stated that the issue will be addressed. He stated he appreciated Mr. White's comments.

**Carole Burns** stated she is speaking on behalf of the Eastwood Homeowners Association and she would like to know if legislation can be enacted or enforced to limit the number of cars parked in the driveway. She reported there is a residence on Hathaway Lane that have five vehicles in the driveway at all times and sometimes there are six. She stated she walks all over the neighborhood.

**Mayor Sellers** asked if the cars are on the sidewalk.

**Ms. Burns** stated that the cars are parked in the driveway over the sidewalk and the apron so she has to walk around the cars. She reported that her second concern is the empty lot east of Westwood School that is used for dumping. She stated that she mentioned it last year that there are tires, trash pop bottles etc. She inquired if a sign that reads Under Surveillance No Dumping can be put in the area with a camera as she has seen as sign like that in Cleveland.

**Mayor Sellers** responded that they will inspect it and be in contact with Sherwin Williams. He reported that it is private property so permission would be needed for signage.

**Economic Development – Manager Raymon Turner had nothing to report.**

**Personnel Department – Director Nicole Johnson had nothing to report.**

**Police Department – Chief Wes Haynes thanked the Mayor and City Council for approving Items Three and Six for the Police Department.**

**Mayor Sellers** asked how many miles are on the vehicles being traded.

**Chief Haynes** reported that the GMC has 110,000 miles and the 2007 Impala has 153,000 miles.

**Building Department – Commissioner Ben Brown** wished everyone a good evening. He reported that our High Grass Nuisance Abatement Program started this week. He stated inspectors have begun the process of notifying owners who are not in compliance. He stated it usually takes us about two-three weeks to get caught up on the grass, especially due to all the rain so he asked that residents be patient.

**Mayor Sellers** asked Ben to explain how the program works.

**Commissioner Brown** stated the process is that once the owners are notified, they have three days to cut the grass. He reported if it is not abated, a contractor is sent out to the property to abate it at cost. He stated that we have two contractors, Northcoast and Bonner.

**Mayor Sellers** inquired how many cuts are done during the summer.

**Commissioner Brown** answered that on average they could do almost 200 properties and sometimes they can end up going to a property up to four times depending on the weather resulting in almost 1000 cuts in the summer.

**Service Department – Director Ted Sims** wished all the ladies a Happy Mother's Day!

**Civic & Senior Center – Director Jennifer Lastery** thanked Council and the Mayor for such a wonderful Senior Luncheon. She stated that she is still looking to see what other Cities offers a nice luncheon for 500 seniors in their community because she has not seen one yet! She stated she is honored that everything turned out as well as it did and is in awe of what Council and the Mayor does for the seniors.

**Council President's Comments**

Council President wished everyone a good evening. She thanked everyone for attending the meeting and stated their words mean a lot because a lot of things they see, we don't so it helps us be more involved and active in the City. She reported that her honoree was not present at the Senior Luncheon but was at the meeting so she asked Carole Burns to stand up. Ms. Burns has already left the meeting and Council President commented that she is always doing that!

She commented that Ms. Burns's voice was the one you heard ever so vigilantly speaking on what was happening in the community. She stated that is why Ms. Burns was the honoree for Ward 2 because keeps an eye out for me and for you. She congratulated all the graduates in the lives of the people at the meeting and to all mothers in their lives.

**Mayor's Comments**

Mayor Sellers thanked everyone for coming out and said Happy Mother's Day to everyone in attendance. He stated he appreciated everyone's concern and letting him know what is going on. He commented that there are other ways to inform him of what is going on and they do not have to come to the meeting. He stated that if you have access to the internet, you can inform us what is going on via the website. He stated that it is important to have communication in the City and let people know how things are supposed to be done. He gave the example of someone that moved into his area and put their trash out too early in the day and he had to inform them of the appropriate time.

He stated he is going to make sure that the front side of Cinema Park is taken care of and that he and his staff met with the irrigation people today.

He remarked that he is proud of his group for the Senior Luncheon and of the 500 tickets available, 480 people attended. He commented that this is an even that has been well-attended for decades. He stated the event started in 2012 and he wants to make sure that people doing good work continue to be recognized.

He reported that today was the first graduating class of young doctors at Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine. He reported it is one of three campuses that they have; the other two are in Athens and Dublin. He stated the first graduating class consisted of 46 students at the campus here in Warrensville Heights and was held at the Science Center. He commented how there is a shortage of Primary Care doctors due to medical students pursuing specialized medicine. He reported that Ohio University and Cleveland Clinic came up with a

program to put more doctors here. He stated that they are recruiting people that have ties to this area. He stated that Council and the City have been supportive of the program and working with Warrensville City Schools and Ohio University to put together a program that exposes a Warrensville students to the medical fields. He stated he was told that one of our kids at Ohio University applied to the medical school and was accepted.

He stated we took the initiative and started planting some seeds around here. He stated he hopes that the student makes it though and goes back into the community and start telling people how he got it done. Mayor Sellers commented that he thinks the person is one of their Summer interns.

He stated the "long game" is that we have to be proactive and not reactive; there is an opportunity floating around here. He stated that this building is not conducive to do business; we have to catch up to the game and think forward. He commented that the South University building is 5 years old and is 40,000 square feet and came to us by accident and we have an opportunity to unify our entire operation. He commented that the jail that they have in the back is going to be ruled non-compliant due to the age of it. He announced our day is coming sooner than later and it is time for us to explore because a one-stop shop is what we need that include Police, Building, Finance, Tax, Administrative, Personnel and Communications. He added that there are also discussions with the School Board for the additional space in the building. He commented that City Departments and the School Board can be housed in the same building on one bus line so it is convenient.

Mayor Sellers stated that there is a development opportunity on Northfield Road so it is important that we figure out what we are doing. He reminded everyone that Eastwood and John Dewey schools are coming down in 2020. He remarked there are decisions that cannot be put off any longer and we have to figure it out as a group how to proceed.
